Dr. John Lowe, a virologist and environmental scientist, is assistant professor of Environmental Health at the University of Nebraska Medical Center. He is also director of research for the Nebraska Biocontainment Unit and director of Public Health Exercise and Training Programs for the Center for Preparedness Education at the Nebraska Medical Center. Along with Dr. Gibbs, Dr. Lowe oversees the BIDTI as one of its two principal investigators. Dr. Lowe's research focuses on the remediation of biological weapon contamination, highly infectious patient transport, nosocomial environmental contamination, and gaseous decontamination. He has published at least 10 articles related to Ebola virus disease and has served as a subject matter expert in multiple national webinars and teleconferences hosted by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

In coordination with the CDC and state departments of health, Dr. Lowe also provided on-site assessment of protocols, procedures, and physical structure to designated Ebola treatment centers.
